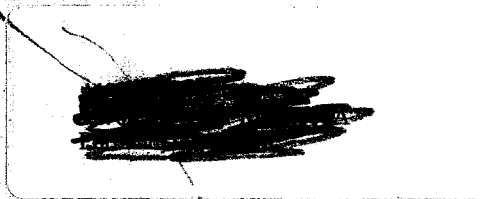

The 15th Regt. Infy
was organized and mustered at Camp
Butler on February 14th, 1862, by Capt.
James H. Hall of C. M. U. S. A.

The regiment left

Camp Butler, Feb. 18th Mos. and
arrived, by rail, via. Lafayette, Ind.
Indianapolis and Louisville, at
Nashville, Tenn. on the 21st.

On the 25th it was ordered to
Bridgeport Alabama, where it
arrived the next day. The right
wing with Head Quarter remained
at that place, while the left
wing was distributed in companies or
squads along the railroad at various

Blackhouse and station between
Bridgeport and Chattanooga, Tenn.
March 13th the ^{regt} was incorporated into
the 2nd Brigade 2^d Superior Division
Army of the Cumberland. Brevet

Major Gen. Felix Price Salmon
commanding Brigade. March 25th

The regiment was ordered to with the
Brigade to Cleveland, Tenn. where
the usual routine of post duty
was performed. Several

scouting parties were sent out and
succeeded in capturing a number
of guerrillas.

May 2nd the
regiment with the brigade was ordered
to Dalton Geo. May 15th

five companies A, C, D, E and G
under command of Lt. Col. G.
H. Springer were ordered
to Spring Place Geo. July 4th

the five companies were ordered
from Spring Place to remain

The regiment at Fort...

July 8th the regiment with
the brigade was ordered to
Atlanta, Georgia. During
the early part of August the
Brigade was broken up and the
regiment transferred to the District
of Alabama 3^d Div. Dept of
Gen. Brig. Gen. H. M. Judah
commanding District. Aug 12th
the Regt was ordered to garrison
the different Posts in 2^d sub-
District and Lt. Col. Springer
to assume the command of the District
as follows, with head quarters at
Griffin, Geo.

pro tem. July 23th Major H. A.
Buck was appointed surgeon in
charge of Post Hospital as volunteer

appointed. Capt. Provost Martin
for the City of Atlanta

July 23^d Capt W. G. Barnes
(Co. F) with 100 men were ordered
to do provost guard duty in Atlanta

Court Martial at Atlanta Ga
Sept 29th Capt W. G. Barnes
Co F was appointed inspector
Gen of Dist of Atlanta. vice
Capt Key resigned. Oct 4th
Lt Carroll, Co G, was appointed
Asst Provost Marshal of 1st Sub Div
Oct 5th Capt. S. L. Parker Co E
was appointed the second time
as Provost Judge at city of
Atlanta. Lt C. F. Reynolds
(of Co I) was then appointed
Provost Marshal of 2nd Sub Div
Dist of Atlanta.

Cot. Keener obtained leave
of absence in June and then
tendered his resignation, which
he claims has been accepted;
but as no official notice of such
acceptance has been received
